Outdoor Fire Ring

Operating Instructions

Lighting

- 1. Make sure there is no more than a small amount of ash in the bottom of the outdoor Fire Ring.
- 2. Place a layer of dry kindling or a natural fire starter in the center.
- 3. Place above that of dry kindling a layer of dry seasoned hardwood that is cut to lengths no more than 3/4 the diameter of the outdoor Fire Ring.
- 4. Use a match or fire starter to light kindling.
- 5. Using a hook and heat resistant gloves, position the grate once the kindling is lit.

Tending the Fire

- 1. You may need to shift and/or add logs for an ideal experience.
- 2. Do NOT place a hot grate or hot fireplace tools onto combustible surfaces such as grass, leaves, wooden deck, or furniture.
- 3. Always use a hook and heat resistant gloves to position the grate.
- 4. Always use a long-handled fireplace tool to shift coals and logs to allow additional airflow.
- 5. Do NOT add gasoline, kerosene, diesel fuel, lighter fluid, or alcohol to relight or enhance an existing fire.
- 6. Wait until glowing coals have developed before adding any additional wood. If additional wood is required, place wood on top coals. Be careful not to shift ashes.

Extinguishing

- 1. Allow fire to burn itself out.
- 2. Do NOT use water to extinguish as this is dangerous and can cause damage to the outdoor Fire Ring.

Inspecting

- 1. The outdoor Fire Ring should be inspected on a regular basis to ensure product safety and longer product life.
- 2. Do NOT attempt to inspect the outdoor Fire Ring until the fire is COMPLETELY out.
- 3. Routinely check the grate and any other sliding or moveable parts of the outdoor Fire Ring to make sure everything is secure.
- 4. If damage to any component is detected, do NOT operate until repairs are executed.

Cleaning

- 1. The outdoor Fire Ring should be cleaned on a regular basis to promote safer experiences and longer product life.
- 2. Do NOT attempt to clean the outdoor Fire Ring until the fire is COMPLETELY out.
- 3. Do NOT use oven cleaner or abrasive cleaners as they will damage this product.
- 4. Do NOT use pressure washer to clean the outdoor Fire Ring.
- 5. Remove built-up creosote from with a chimney cleaning product. WARNING: Wear appropriate gloves, protective clothing, eye protection, and a mask when cleaning, because creosote is a toxic substance.

Deaths, serious injury, or damage to property may occur if the above is not followed exactly.
