

# Outdoor Fire Ring

# WARNING

# FOR YOUR SAFETY

1. The Fire Ring is for outdoor use only and shall NOT be used in or near a building, garage, or any other enclosed area.
2. Do NOT use the outdoor Fire Ring for indoor heating. TOXIC carbon monoxide fumes can accumulate and cause asphyxiation.
3. The outdoor Fire Ring is not intended for commercial use.
4. Keep extinguishers accessible at all times while operating the outdoor Fire Ring.
4. This outdoor Fire Ring is NOT to be operated or used by children.
5. Do NOT use the Fire Ring on or in the immediate vicinity of boats, recreational vehicles, automobiles, trucks, van, or motorcycles, UTVs, or ATVs.
6. When using the outdoor Fire Ring, exercise the same precautions you would with any open fire.
7. The use of alcohol, a prescription drug, or a non-prescription (Over-the-Counter) drug may impair the consumer's ability to properly assemble or safely operate the outdoor Fire Ring.
8. Do NOT use the outdoor Fire Ring without reading the entire "Instruction Manual".
9. The outdoor Fire Ring is for use with dry, seasoned hardwood. It will burn hotter, more completely and create less smoke.
10. Do NOT burn charcoal, manufactured logs, driftwood, trash, leaves, paper, cardboard, plywood, painted or stained or pressure treated wood. Avoid using softwoods such as pine or cedar that can throw sparks.
11. Do NOT alter or modify the outdoor Fire Ring in any manner.

12. Do NOT use the outdoor Fire Ring until it is COMPLETELY assembled and all parts are securely fastened and tightened.
13. Do NOT store or use gasoline or other flammable vapors or liquids in the vicinity of the outdoor Fire Ring. Do NOT use in an explosive atmosphere.
14. Keep the outdoor Fire Ring area clear and free from gasoline, varnish, paint thinner, lighter fluid, and other flammable liquids, as well as all combustible materials such as wood, dry plants, grass, brush, paper, or canvas.
15. Do NOT store or use an LP gas cylinder within 25 feet (8 m) of the outdoor Fire Ring while it is in operation.
16. Do NOT use the outdoor Fire Ring under or near any overhead or near any unprotected combustible constructions. Avoid using near or under overhanging trees and shrubs.
17. Always use the outdoor Fire Ring on hard-packed dirt, free from grass, leaves, and other vegetation. Concrete, rock, stone, asphalt, and blacktop surfaces are NOT acceptable. Do NOT use on or near wooden decks.
18. Do NOT wear flammable or loose clothing when operating the outdoor Fire Ring.
19. Do NOT use in windy conditions.
20. Discontinue or stop use immediately if sparks occur and escape the outdoor Fire Ring.
21. Do NOT use gasoline, kerosene, diesel fuel, lighter fluid or alcohol to light or relight fires.
22. Keep all electrical cords away from a hot fireplace.
23. All surfaces of this outdoor fireplace are hot when in operation. To avoid burns, do NOT touch fireplace until it has completely cooled unless you are wearing protective gear. Use extreme caution. Potholders, fire-retardant gloves, BBQ mittens, and hot pads may NOT be sufficient to prevent burns. Never touch ashes or coals to determine if they are hot.
24. Do NOT leave a lit outdoor Fire Ring unattended, especially around children and pets.
25. Do NOT attempt to move or store the outdoor Fire Ring until all ashes and coals are completely extinguished.

26. Do NOT remove ashes or coals until they are completely and fully extinguished.
27. Use long, sturdy fireplace tools when adding or moving logs.
28. Do NOT overload the outdoor Fire Ring. Do NOT add additional firewood until the fire burns down. NOTICE: If any portion of the outdoor Fire Ring is glowing red, it is overloaded.
29. Do NOT lean over the outdoor Fire Ring when lighting or when in use.
30. Do NOT place hot fireplace tools or a hot grate onto combustible surfaces such as grass, wooden deck, or furniture.
31. Avoid breathing smoke from the fire and avoid getting it into your eyes. WARNING: Firewood that contains poison ivy or oak, when burned, may release harmful substances. WARNING: Treated lumber, plastic, Styrofoam, and many other materials when burned, will release toxic or fatal fumes.
32. The outdoor Fire Ring should be thoroughly inspected and cleaned on a regular basis. Remove and clean creosote build-up. WARNING: Wear appropriate gloves, protective clothing, eye protection, and a mask when cleaning, because creosote is a toxic substance.

Deaths, serious injury, or damage to property may occur if the above is not followed exactly.
